- **BENCHMARK ASSESSMENT**

All students must be administered benchmark assessments at the beginning, middle and end of each school year for in every content area.

- **GRADING SYSTEM / REPORT CARDS**

There are four marking periods to the school year with report cards issued for grades PK – 6.

Parent conferences will be held in February for all students, but a teacher and/or parent may request a conference at any time. The Superintendent is always available for a conference with parents regarding any matter.

Students in grades 4-6 are eligible for the Honor Roll and recognized at an Honor Roll Assembly held every marking period. In order to be recognized, students must receive an “A” or “B” with an indicator of a 3 or above in all subjects, and an “O” or “S” in special area subjects and comments.

- **PARENT PORTAL**

Parents can access the progress of their child/ren by going on the Parent Portal and by weekly reports sent home from the teacher. You should communicate with parents weekly about the status of their child's academic and behavioral progress. Tests/grades, etc. should be recorded within one week of issuance.

- **PROMOTION & RETENTION**

A pupil will be promoted to the next succeeding grade level when he/she demonstrates the proficiencies required for movement into the next grade.

Procedures for pupil promotion:

1. Parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and pupils will be provided a minimum of four reports each year as to a pupil's progress towards meeting promotion standards.
2. Teachers who determine that a pupil's progress may not be sufficient to meet promotion standards shall notify the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of the pupil and offer consultation with the parents or legal guardians.
3. In grades PreK-6, the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and where appropriate the pupil will be notified no later than three weeks prior to the end of the year when the possibility of a pupil not being promoted is determined.
4. A pupil with fewer than 155 days attendance in grades PreK-6 may not be promoted to the next grade level.
5. Extenuating circumstances as determined by the Chief School Administrator can waive the 180-day attendance requirements for grades PreK-6.
6. Classroom teachers shall provide input to the Chief School Administrator who makes the final decision concerning the promotion or retention of each pupil.
